BRAD GOULD ELECTED TO THE FICPA BOARD OF GOVERNORS

Fort Pierce, Fla. - Brad Gould was elected to the Board of Governors of the Florida Institute of Certified Public Accountants (FICPA) on May 10, 2012. His two year term as a Member-at-Large will begin on July 1, 2012.
